Best practice requires a level of agreement about evidence to be integrated into practice. The challenge now is to answer this question: "How can practice be built based on evidence and an environment supportive of this kind of practice?" The struggle needing to be faced is how to devise strategies to operationalize best practice.

Evidence-Based Practices: Practices that integrate the best research evidence with clinical expertise and patient values. Practice-Based Evidence : A range of treatment approaches and supports that are derived from, and supportive of, the positive cultural of the local society and traditions.

Evidence-based Practices & Practice-based Evidence

NCAEP (2020) and the National Standards Project (NSP, 2015) published reports of their systematic reviews of the literature and identification of evidence-based practices. Nineteen of the NCAEP EBPs were also identified as established interventions in the NSP report. Five of the NCAEP EBPs were identified as emerging interventions (i.e., some evidence but not sufficient to be classified as an EBP).

Evidence-based practice has gained momentum in nursing, and definitions vary widely.
