Dysphagia Screening

Screening for dysphagia may be conducted by a speech-language pathologist or other member of the patient's care team. Screening does not provide a detailed description of the patient's swallow function but, rather, identifies individuals who are likely to have swallowing impairments related to function, activity, and/or participation as defined by the World Health Organization (WHO, 2001).

Early identification of dysphagia by screening is recommended best practice for patients admitted to hospital with acute stroke. Screening can reduce the risk of pneumonia and promote stroke recovery, yet some institutions do not utilize a formal screening protocol.

The intervention consisted of early screening with a clinical method of dysphagia screening, the Gugging Swallowing Screen, and intensified oral hygiene. Results: The incidence of x-ray verified pneumonia was 4 of 58 (7%) in the intervention group compared with 16 of 58 (28%) in the internal control group (p < .01) and with 8 of 30 (27%) in the external control group (p < .05).

A bedside swallow exam is a test to see if you might have dysphagia, which causes trouble swallowing. Dysphagia sometimes leads to serious problems. When you swallow, food passes through your mouth and into a part of your throat called the pharynx. From there, it travels through a long tube called the esophagus.

If any of the responses are "no" and the screen is stopped, then he/she should remain NPO until further dysphagia evaluation by speech therapy is completed. Speech therapy requires a physician order. If answers to all screening questions are "YES", Contact the physician with the result, and for diet and PO medication orders.

Nursing Swallowing Screen

The M.D. Anderson Dysphagia Index (MDADI) is a valid, reliable questionnaire for people with head and neck cancer. Amy Chen, MD, MPH and colleagues developed this quality of life measurement tool, which was published in 2001. The 20-question tool may be used to show change over time.

Dysphagia is a common stroke symptom and leads to serious complications such as aspiration and pneumonia. Early dysphagia screening can reduce these complications. In many hospitals, dysphagia screening is performed by speech-language therapists who are often not available on weekends/holidays, which results in delayed dysphagia assessment.

Background: National guidelines recommend dysphagia screening (DS) before oral intake in stroke patients to reduce hospital-acquired pneumonia (HAP). We examined the relationship between DS and HAP after ischemic stroke.

Water swallow test (WST) is commonly applied for dysphagia screening [11]. A validation study of WST documented a sensitivity of 96.5%, a specificity of 48.7%, and a false positive rate of 51.3% [12]. Dysphagia can also be assessed with other bedside tests, such as Volume Viscosity Swallow Test (V-VST) and Minimal Eating Observation Form-vers.

Systematic Dysphagia Screening of Elderly Persons in the ...

Dysphagia screening is defined as a "pass/fail procedure to identify individuals who require a comprehensive referral to other professional and/or medical services." 14 (p10) Screening procedures identify patients who need a complete dysphagia evaluation, including a clinical evaluation of swallowing mechanisms and function that uses different food and liquid consistencies. 13

Validation of a Postextubation Dysphagia Screening Tool ...

Swallowing difficulties in the mouth and throat are called "oropharyngeal dysphagia" and are evaluated and managed by speech-language pathologists in the Head & Neck Center. Swallowing difficulties in the esophagus are called "esophageal dysphagia" and are evaluated and managed by specialists in the Gastroenterology Center.
